IV. <u>EXEMPTIONS UNDER SECTION 4d(3) OF THE PERSONNEL CODE (continued)</u>

B. <u>Governing Rule - Jurisdiction B Exemptions</u>

- a) Before a position shall qualify for exemption from Jurisdiction B under Section 4d(3) of the Personnel Code, the position shall be directly responsible to:
 - 1. The Governor, or
 - 2. A departmental director or assistant director appointed by the Governor, or
 - 3. A board or commission appointed by the Governor, or
 - 4. The head of an agency created by Executive Order, or the director or assistant director of an agency carrying out statutory powers, whose offices are created by the Governor subject to legislative veto under Article V, Section 11, of the Constitution of 1970, which agency head, director, or assistant director may themselves be subject to exemption under Section 4d(3), or
 - 5. In an agency having a statutory assistant director, a deputy director exercising full line authority under the director for all operating entities of the agency, provided the statutory role of assistant director is vacant or is assigned clearly distinct and separate duties from the deputy director and as a colleague to him, or
 - 6. A line position organizationally located between the director and/or assistant director and a subordinate statutorily exempt position(s), provided the position proposed for exemption has line authority over the statutory exempt position(s), or
 - 7. The elected head of an independent agency in the executive, legislative, or judicial branch of government.
- b) If a position meets the above criterion, it must, in addition, be responsible for one or more of the following before it shall be approved as exempt:
 - 1. Directs programs defined by statute and/or departmental, board, or commission policy or possess significant authority when acting in the capacity of a director of programs to bind the agency.
 - 2. Makes decisions in exercising principal responsibility for the determination or execution of policy which fix objectives or state the principles to control action toward operating objectives of one or more divisions, such decisions being subject to review or reversal only by the director, assistant director, board or commission.
 - 3. Participates in the planning and programming of departmental, board, or commission activities, integrating the plans and projections of related divisions, and the scheduling of projected work programs of those agencies.
 - 4. Makes decisions in exercising principal responsibility for the determination or execution of policy which fix objectives or state the principles to control action toward operating objectives of one or more divisions, such decisions being subject to review or reversal only by the director, assistant director, board or commission.
 - 5. Participates in the planning and programming of departmental, board, or commission activities, integrating the plans and projections of related divisions, and the scheduling of projected work programs of those agencies.

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IV. <u>EXEMPTIONS UNDER SECTION 4d(3) OF THE PERSONNEL CODE (continued)</u>

- Regarding C and D, the Chief Legal Counsel at the IHPA and the Chief Fiscal Officer at the ISBI respectively, Executive Director Daniel Stralka, reported that the positions met both the policy making and reporting requirements of Rule 11. For those reasons, the staff recommended exemption.
- Regarding Items E1 and E2, Assistant Executive Director Andrew Barris reported that the staff had questions regarding the organizational structure of the Department of Aging. After receiving a revised organizational chart that accurately reflected that the proposed positions reported to the Deputy Director, the staff concluded that both positions met both the principal policy making and reporting requirements of Rule 11 and, therefore, recommended exemption.
- Regarding Items F and G, the Hispanic Liaison at OSFM and the Program Administrator at the Department of Revenue respectively, Executive Director Dan Stralka reported that the positions met both the reporting and the policy-making requirements of Rule 11. Therefore, the staff recommended exemption.
- Regarding Item H, Assistant Executive Director Andrew Barris reported that the position of Chief Legal Counsel at the IWCC met both the reporting and principal policy making requirements of Rule 11.
- Regarding Items I1, I2, and I3, the staff recommended that the positions' 4d3 exempt status be revoked on September 30, 2005.
